## **Charity Status Granted**

On the 20<sup>th</sup> of September, 2024, the team was very pleased to receive formal notice from the UK Charities Commission informing us that **LeoGen** has now been formally granted recognition and has been entered onto the Register of Charities with the Registered Charity Number 1210151.

This officially grants LeoGen the status of a Legal Entity in its own right, allowing us to formally enter into agreements with third party companies, institutions and other organisations.

It also enables us to raise the funds that will be necessary to achieve our goals, to pursue a breeding programme that will improve the health outcomes of future generations of Leonbergers.

The project will benefit many other breeds as well by providing a model and proof of concept for a new, genetically sustainable approach to pedigree dog breeding, which will ideally lead to healthier future populations of companion dogs.
